

Our Non-Profit has evolved since our original inception. We started out as a classroom with four walls to a program without walls. Napa Valley Unified (NVUSD) saw a greater need for Assistive Technology (AT) and has hired a full-time AT teacher to meet the need throughout the district. The district has also dedicated more teachers and support staff to the Assistive Technology Lending Library (ATLL) which is operated in conjunction with the Napa County Office of Education (NCOE) Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA). We are pleased to be working with two agencies dedicated to helping all students achieve success.

Our current project has partnered us with NVUSD to design a summer school program which will bring children who use AAC and AT together focusing on advancing communication skills as well as incorporating more movement opportunities.

Because of our fundraising efforts, we continue to provide training and education to staff, parents and children. Keeping up on technology is imperative. This year, we sent four people to the Closing the Gap Conference in Minnesota. Closing the Gap provides professionals, parents and consumers with the information and training necessary to best locate, compare and implement assistive technology into the lives of persons with disabilities.

Here are some comments about how this made a difference:

It was an invaluable experience for me and my students. Since the conference I have redesigned our reading program, received new math and reading curriculum, and increased my focus on classroom seating and its effects on student learning.
